Righteousness Exalts National Morality

Scripture Reading Before Invocation Prayer: I John 2: 15 – 17

Scripture Lesson: I Timothy 1: 1 – 11 the righteous ethical standard based on God's moral law.
Refs: Psalm 19: 7, Romans 3: 19 – 20, St. Luke 5: 32, St. Matthew 9: 13, I Timothy 1: 15,
Galatians 3: 18 – 29.

Subject: **RIGHTEOUSNESS EXALTETH A NATION: BUT SIN IS A REPROACH TO ANY PEOPLE.** Proverbs 14: 34(KJV)

Text: Romans 7: 7 – 14 Without a righteous standard of law in society, it's harder for people to get saved; because there is no standard or moral conviction.

Introduction: Exodus 20: 1 – 17 The Ten Commandments, also known as the moral law; is transcultural, multigenerational, always relevant and is a reflection of the character, nature and holiness of God Himself. The Ten Commandments were oftentimes repeated in the New Testament.
Refs: Romans 13: 9, Ephesians 6: 1 – 13, St. Matthew 19: 16 – 21, St. Mark 10: 17 – 22, St. Luke 18: 18 – 23. The Law cannot save us, but it is a standard for righteousness and ethics; in civil society as well as in the Church; however, it can condemn us!
