## **BLINDED EYES CAN'T SEE**

Scripture reading before Invocation Prayer: St. Luke 4: 18

Scripture Lesson: Isaiah 6: 1 - 10 (cf. St. John 12: 35 - 41)

Subject: **JESUS SAID UNTO THEM, IF YE WERE BLIND, YE SHOULD HAVE NO SIN: BUT NOW YE SAY, WE SEE; THEREFORE YOUR SIN REMAINETH.** (St. John 9: 41) KJV

Text: Romans 11: 13 - 25 Blindness in part is happened to Israel.

Introduction: Romans 2: 16 - 29 confident that thou thyself art a guide of the blind.

## **Lesson Outline**

- 1. St. John 9: 39 41 Are we blind also? The greatest hindrance to "Salvation" is self-sufficiency; thinking you know. Leaning on your insight and foresight as sufficient for your own guidance. Now that you have some knowledge, you think you can see better than anyone can show you, therefore your sins remain. If you were sensible of your own blindness, you would soon accept Christ as your guide and have your sins forgiven; and have no sin.
- 2. St. Matthew 6: 22 23 (cf. St. Luke 11: 34 36) The light of the body is the eye
- 3. II Peter 1: 1-9 he that lacketh these things is blind. (cf. II Corinthians 4:4)
- 4. St. Matthew 23: 8 39 Woe unto you, ye fools and blind
- 5. Revelation 3: 14 22 knowest not that thou art wretched, miserable, poor, blind and naked?
- 6. I John 1: 6 10 if we say we have fellowship with him and walk in darkness, we lie.
- 7. Acts 26: 18 To open their eyes and to turn them from darkness to light
