THE FIRST COMMANDMENT

Scripture Reading before Invocation Prayer: Proverbs 3:5-10

Scripture Lesson: St. Matthew 22: 34 - 40 (cf. Deuteronomy 6:4 – 5, St. Mark 12: 28 - 34)

Subject: THOU SHALT LOVE THE LORD THY GOD WITH ALL THY HEART, AND WITH ALL THY SOUL, AND WITH ALL THY MIND... AND THY NEIGHBOR AS THYSELF.

Text: I John 4: 7 - 13 "LOVE IS A RESPONSE", we love him because He first loved us.

<u>Lesson Outline</u> – Love is the More Excellent Way

- 1. Galatians 5: 14 26 all the law is fulfilled in one word... "It's all about love"
- 2. James 2: 8 11 If ye fulfill the royal law, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thy self.
- 3. I Timothy 1: 5 13 The end of the Commandment is charity out of a pure heart.
- 4. Romans 13: 8 10 he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. "LOVE IS THE FULFILLING OF THE LAW"
- 5. St. Matthew 5: 44 48 love your enemies. What do we more than others?
- 6. St. Matthew 7: 12 "The Golden rule" The Law and the Prophets and the Gospel!
- 7. St. John 14: 15, 21 if ye love me, keep my commandments.

Self-love is not selfish love, egotistical or self-centered, but taking care to feed and clothe yourself, to work and make a honest living, respect yourself, watch how you live, walk circumspectly, responsibilities, goals, purpose, and concern for the welfare of our own souls.
