The Sluggard and the Diligent

Scripture Reading before Invocation Prayer: I Thessalonians 5: 14 warn them that won't work Scripture Lesson: Proverbs 6: 6 – 8 Solomon says Go to the ant, thou sluggard: (cf. Proverbs 30: 25) Hardworking, disciplined, foresight, initiative, diligence: Prudent expectations of future needs. Like the Ant we must work while its day (John 9: 4). We must lay up treasure for our future (Matthew 6:19, Luke 16: 8-9). We must not be slothful in business (Romans 12: 11). We should serve one another (Galatians. 5: 13).

Subject: THE SOUL OF THE SLUGGARD DESIRETH, AND HATH NOTHING; BUT THE SOUL OF THE DILIGENT SHALL BE MADE FAT. (Proverbs 13: 4) KJV

Text: II Thessalonians 3: 10 - 12 he that will not labor let him hunger and let him not eat.

Introduction: Proverbs 21: 5 do not shrink back from the toil, "haste makes waste" and poverty.

- 2. Proverbs 21: 25-26 The desire of the slothful killeth him; he is an enemy to himself. Their slothfulness starves them while their desires stab them. They expect everybody to do for them.
- 3. Proverbs 26: 13 16 He will not take pain to get wisdom because he thinks he is wise enough already. His good opinion of himself is the reason for his slothfulness, has many reasons why they can't work.
- 4. Proverbs 10: 4 he becometh poor who dealeth with a slack hand, the hand of the diligent maketh rich.
- 5. Hebrews 6: 10 12 that ye be not slothful, but diligent with full assurance unto the end.
- 6. I Corinthians 15: 58 Beloved be steadfast for as much as ye know your labor is not in vain in the Lord

Sluggard – someone who is disinclined to work or exert himself, slackers, lazybones. Irresponsibility causes ruin. This shortcoming will rob a person of every resource until nothing is left. Hands that refuse to work eventually spiral down to discontent, frustration, lack of purpose in life to ruin. Lethargic, lackadaisical, Apathetic, indifferent, lukewarm, do-nothing attitude.

The Diligent - Hard work combined with discipline and forethought equals true wisdom, according to Solomon. God is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him (Hebrews 11: 6).
